Ithan Valley Park

642 South Ithan Avenue, Bryn Mawr
20.5 acres, Ward 5

Once known as the Grow Tract, Ithan Valley Park was part of an estate owned by John Evans that was donated to the Township for use as a park when the Blue Route was constructed in 1973. In the 18th and 19th centuries, a family mill and farm was run on the land. Remnants of an old mill are located near the parking area. The site was transformed in the 1900s into a grand estate known as Timberline. Both the owners of the mill and estate were keenly interested in botany and collected trees from both North America and the Old World. The Ithan Valley Tree Identification Committee was formed to identify which trees were either old enough to have been part of the original collection or seedlings of those trees. There are 22 species identified and are roughly located going up the old driveway from what is now the parking area. They include White Oak, Fir, Tulip, Sugar Maple, Magnolia, Buckeye, False Cypress, and Cork, to name a few. In the mid-1800s, prior to being turned into an estate, Ithan Valley Park was regarded as one of the most significant botanical sites in the United States. In 2011, the Friends of Ithan Valley Park was formed to celebrate the history of the park and begin a preservation effort. The Friends have been working on various projects to enhance the park and call attention to its heritage as an arboretum and its historical trees. What a fascinating park right here in Radnor Township!

WELCOME TO ITHAN VALLEY PARK

EVANS ARBORETUM

John Evans (1790-1862) inherited his Quaker family's farm and mills at the age of 16. The 133 acre property was bordered by what is now Sproul Road to the west, Clyde Road to the north, South Ithan Avenue to the east and Roberts Road along the south (originally continuing in a westerly direction).

By the late 1820s, Evans developed an interest in botany and began trading specimens among his contemporaries including Colonel Carr, son-in-law to John Bartram and the Painter brothers, whose collection later became Tyler Arboretum. He recognized that his lands offered ideal and varying conditions for different types of trees, including sun, shade, dry and wet conditions.

Evans collected tree and plant samples along the East Coast as far north as Vermont and as far west as

Ohio. He later began a multi-decade correspondence and trading relationship with Sir William Hooker, director of the Royal Botanic Gardens in Kew, England. Hooker's son, Sir Joseph Hooker, was a noted explorer at the time, who collected botanical samples from his travels and sent them home to his father.


Despite his poor record keeping, at the time of his death, Evans' collection of trees and specimens from around the world was regarded by J. W. Harshberger as "in the number of distinct trees and shrubbery... the largest in the country." He considered Evans himself along with John Bartram and Minshall Painter as the pre-eminent botanists in Philadelphia.

Following his death, and the gradual demise of the milling business in the area, Evans' family eventually sold off the farm in parcels.

Enjoy this tranquil park that takes on the spirit of this quiet and unassuming man – John Evans.





The property was divided by the construction of I-476, leaving the eastern portion available for parkland. This land was later combined with property to the south to form Ithan Valley Park (in green).



TIMBERLINE ESTATE

In 1906, noted financier W. Hinckle Smith bought up the parceled lands that had comprised the Evans Arboretum. Here he built a beautiful mansion he named "Timberline," designed by noted architect Charles Adams Platt. Recognizing the beautiful collection of trees remaining, Smith and Platt incorporated the trees into the estate design. Following Smith's death in 1943, the property was again split up and portions were purchased by the School District, a land developer, and PennDOT.

The remaining 14-acre section was acquired by Radnor Township and dedicated as Ithan Valley Park, with an additional 7 acres to the north added later on. Some of the trees from Evans' collection still remain along with remnants of the mill buildings, mill race, and Timberline-era plantings.

- ✓ Individuals or families desiring the use of Radnor Township park and picnic areas must obtain a picnic permit from the Radnor Township Recreation and Community Programming Department Office. Please contact 610-688-5600, extension 149 to request an application for the use of a park or picnic area and to check for space availability.
- ✓ It is required that a completed application be filed prior to requested date. The permit is not valid until all fees have been paid. The balance due must be paid in advance of use along with any insurance certificates or other requirements. The approved permit is required to be on site during and throughout the reservation time.
- ✓ Cars are to be parked in designated areas only.
- ✓ ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE PROHIBITED.
- ✓ Tables are not to be moved.
- ✓ Music and excessive noise are prohibited.
- ✓ Dumping is prohibited.
- ✓ Loitering is prohibited.
- ✓ Fires are to be built only in grills. Areas around grills and picnic tables must be clean at all times. All fires are to be extinguished prior to leaving the premises.
- ✓ Refuse and rubbish are to be placed in the on-site containers.
- ✓ Washing dishes in the drinking fountains is prohibited.
- ✓ Cutting, mutilating, removing or taking any trees, shrubs, flowers, or plants is prohibited.
- ✓ Removal of, or defacing a sign, poster, building, or other property is prohibited.
- ✓ Gambling is prohibited.
- ✓ Fishing in Radnor Township ponds is restricted to CHILDREN, 15 YEARS AND UNDER AND SENIOR CITIZENS. Youth fishing permits are available in the Radnor Township Recreation and Community Programming Department Office.
- ✓ Observe park hours: **DAWN TO DUSK.**
- ✓ **PLEASE NOTE THAT PARK BATHROOMS ARE WINTERIZED IN EARLY NOVEMBER AND WILL REMAIN CLOSED THROUGHOUT THE WINTER MONTHS.**
- ✓ **Please note that some third-party companies are prohibited (ie. Bounce Houses, tents, gaming trucks, etc.) Call for more details.**

Cyclists sound your bell or call out a warning when approaching others, then pass safely on the left. **Runners** Follow travel rules as per bicyclists. Do not perform trick-skating maneuvers on heavily used paths.

Radnor Multipurpose Trail Trail Etiquette & Safety Guidelines

All Users:

- STAY ALERT - Remove headphones and be aware of surroundings at all times.
- Be Courteous - The trails is for all users. Share the trail, and respect other users regardless of sport, speed, or skill level.
- Stay to the right at all times, expect when passing.
- When passing, make sure to look behind you, ring a bell or give a loud audible warning, Ring bell or call out "Passing on Your Left" when passing.
- Pass ONLY to the left and give at 2 foot clearance when passing.
- Do NOT block the trail by going 3 or 4 abreast.
- When stopping move off the trail. Be aware of others approaching you from behind and make sure they know you're pulling over.
- Yield to others when entering the trail and at crosswalks. When in doubt yield to others.
- STOP at stop signs, they indicate dangerous cross car traffic.
- When exiting the trail, stop, look and listen for motor vehicle traffic.
- Do not let your children ramble freely across the trail.
- Stay immediately behind or to the left of your children.
- Wear proper attire and safety gear for your recreational activity, including reflective gear, hat, sun block, helmet, pads, etc.
- Do not leave glass, paper, cans, plastic, or any other debris on or near the trail. Dispose of trash in proper containers.
- Respect private property and the privacy of people living along the trail.

BIKERS AND BLADERS:

- Travel at a safe and controlled speed. The Trail is not an appropriate place for high speed racing.
- Control your bike and be ready to stop.
- Remember: Wheels yield to heels.
- Adjust your speed to trail congestion and surface conditions.
- Be predictable - Travel in a consistent and predictable manner.
- Warn with a loud bell, whistle, or voice well BEFORE overtaking someone.
- Travel in single file, especially during busy times.
- Be sure child bikers are skilled enough to control the bike and maneuver as needed in order to stay safe.

PET OWNERS:

- Keep your pet on a very short leash and under control.
- Treat your pet as you would a child.
- Clean up after pet and dispose of waste in proper trash receptacles.

HIKERS & WALKERS:

- Do NOT READ while on the trail. Stay alert.
- If warned before being passed, call out, "Thanks for the warning!"
- If NOT warned before being passed, politely call out, "Please warn before passing!"
- Protect our environment - Stay on the trail and don't create short cuts or new paths.

Using the registration form, you may register through the mail or in person at the Radnor Township Building, **301 Iven Avenue, Wayne, PA 19087**. The office is open Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00am and 4:00pm. All registration forms must be filled out completely and signed by the parent/guardian of the participant under the age of 18 or the adult registering for the program. Payment in full is required before the start of any program/trip. Radnor residents have priority in program registration.

Payment Methods Accepted: Cash or check made payable to "Radnor Township" are acceptable methods of payment. Visa and MasterCard will be accepted in person only at the Radnor Township Building, 301 Iven Avenue, Wayne, PA during business hours. Credit cards will not be accepted over the telephone. ***Discount tickets can only be purchased using cash or check; no credit cards will be accepted.***

Non-Resident Fee: If you and your family do not reside in Radnor Township, many of our programs are available to you. Non-residents will pay the stated "Non-Resident" rate for a program, which is an additional \$30.00.

Location of Activity/Programs: Please call the Recreation Office 610-688-5600 if you need confirmation or directions. Unless activities are specifically scheduled to take place on school closing days, activities will be canceled when Radnor Township School District schools are closed due to weather or scheduled holidays (**Exceptions Apply**).

Returning from Trips: It is your responsibility to return to the bus at the time announced by your chaperone. Every trip has a time in which you are asked to return to the bus in order to depart to come back to Radnor. If you are late in returning back to the bus for departure and the bus has already left, **you are responsible to provide your own transportation back to Radnor.** At many of our destinations the bus cannot wait for long periods of time for everyone to return.

How to Register for Events, Programs, and Trips: Any event, program, and trip that requires registration will offer specific instruction as to how registration is taken (online, paper registration form, etc.). Completed paper registration forms can be mailed to/dropped off at the Township Municipal Building (301 Iven Avenue, Wayne, PA 19087).
