RE: STAFF TRAFFIC COMMITTEE MEETING HELD IN THE POLICE ROLL CALL ROOM, WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2020, 10:00 AM.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Erin Dunkel requests lighting at the overpass on the bridge at Maplewood Avenue and "No Littering" signage at the same location

Only received one complaint. Steve Norcini will investigate the possibility of the installation of a "cobra light" to alleviate the darkness underneath the bridge. Public Works has removed the graffiti.

2. Officer Charles Farrell of Lower Merion Police Department requests installation of "Do Not Pass" advisory signs to be placed on County Line Road and Airdale Road

Sgt. Stiansen, Officer Matus (ret.) and Bill Cassidy met with Lower Merion Officer Charles Farrell at County Line Rd. and Airdale several months ago to determine a location for the "Do Not Pass" signs to be placed. The signs will be erected as soon as possible.

3. Chief Chris Flanagan would like to discuss roads and flooding and adding water level height signs to existing signs posts

Steve Norcini, Sgt. Stiansen and a representative from TAPCO met at several locations in Wayne for possible areas to place the TAPCO water level signs. These locations were sent to Chief Flanagan. Mr. Norcini states the approval of the TAPCO signs will be at the discretion of the Acting Township Manager and the Board of Commissioners.

4. Chief Chris Flanagan requests Radnor Police Highway Patrol check on the status of painted pedestrian crosswalks, traffic signals and pedestrian signals in the Township.

Radnor Police Highway Patrol did check the status of crosswalks, traffic signals, and ped signals. Bill Cassidy reports they repaint the crosswalks in the Township on an annual basis, weather permitting.

5. Radnor Elementary School Annual 5K to be held on Sunday, May 17, 2020

All insurance and information needed were provided.

6. Catherine Agnew requests approval for the Annual South Wayne Porchfest to be held on Saturday, September 12, 2020 (Rain date: Sunday, September 13th)

All insurance and information needed were provided. Porchfest will request a patrol officer to assist with crossing pedestrians, and bike officer for patrol purposes. They also request CPA members for assistance.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Commissioner Lisa Borowski would like to discuss traffic through the Comrie and Woodstock bus stop and also 320 and Conestoga Road

Carrie O'Donovan reports she still has pedestrian safety concerns on Woodstock and Comrie. Highway Patrol reports conducting Stop Sign Selectives in the 8 o'clock hour during one morning. This resulted in 14 citations being issued to motorists. The traffic counter was placed out. The average speed for vehicles traveling on Woodstock was 21 MPH. Residents are concerned about the volume. The overall volume was similar to a count in 2017; however, volume has increased in the 0800 hrs. – 0900 hrs. time period. This may be a result of the Darby Paoli Rd. detour which causes more volume on Conestoga Rd. The back-up on Conestoga is resulting in vehicles cutting through Woodstock. Steve Norcini has been in touch with Paul Lutz of PennDot. Mr. Lutz was requested to check the timing of the traffic signal at Conestoga and 320 to see if adjustments can be made. Additionally, for pedestrian safety, Officer Janoski states that the children and adults at the bus stop should not be standing farther than necessary out in the street. Highway Patrol reports that while watching the Stop sign and bus pick-up at Woodstock/Comrie observing children standing too far in the street, causing a dangerous situation. Commissioner Borowski reports that she will address this in an upcoming newsletter to her constituents.

Good Morning, Ladies and Gentlemen.

Thank you for giving our neighborhood a spot on your agenda this morning. I would like to thank Lisa Borowski, Chris Flanagan, and Mark Stiansen who responded quickly to my email on Feb. $4^{\rm th}$ for clarification and regarding our concerns. Included in our thanks are those officers who responded to our bus stop on Thursday February $6^{\rm th}$.

I also want to thank the neighbors here today and those who have reached out in the name of traffic safety concerns over the years. Mr. Berardino has requested intervention to enforce complete stops at the corner of Woodstock and S. Spring Mill many times over the last few years. Mr. Pugh requested assistance two years ago with concerns about speed and the number of cars on the roads in our neighborhood. Mrs. Hoffman recently contacted you about cars failing to stop at the corner of Comrie and Woodstock. I reached out last spring expressing my concerns for pedestrian safety – especially regarding our school-age pedestrians using the roads before and after school for their bus stop and recreation. Hopefully this helps to show those present that this is an ongoing issue, which has left the residents of our neighborhood feeling unsafe on our streets.

For those who are unfamiliar, we have been struggling with pedestrian safety for several years. The roads most impacted are those that serve as a cut through between Conestoga and 320 or 30 (Hardwicke, Comrie, Woodstock, and S. Spring Mill). Often during rush hour, we are inundated with vehicles trying to avoid back ups on major roads. Full stops at stop signs along this cut through route are alarmingly rare, rates of speed are unsafe for pedestrians sharing these winding roads with cars, drivers are distractedly looking down at traffic apps, and volume is absolutely overwhelming at times.

I know that Radnor has counted cars in our neighborhood at least twice-which we greatly appreciate, as it's an indication of your responsiveness to potential traffic calming measures. I've read a bit of the Radnor Township Code about Traffic Calming Systems, so I am also aware that for a traffic calming measure such as speed bumps to be considered, over 1000 cars a day would need to be counted in a given area. Those numbers are a perfectly logical starting point...in breaking that number down a bit, 46 cars an hour is a lot of traffic in a residential area where pedestrians must share the road with cars. I am here this morning because sometimes the number of cars traveling through our neighborhood is over 50 in ten minutes when 17 children and their accompanying adults are also in the road. That is a whole new set of numbers. Our neighborhood may not neatly fit into a standard criteria box, but the code at 262A-5, section M also states that the township can consider and install traffic calming measures to protect the health, safety, and welfare of a specific neighborhood, especially for streets with a high concentration of pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Perhaps that is exactly where our numbers fit in.

With these concerns in mind, we would like to arrange a meeting with the township, police, and a small group of neighbors to consider options for traffic calming or other solutions.

Thank you for your time and this opportunity to voice our concerns. We look forward to hearing your thoughts.

CRIME ALERTS MARCH 2020

On Sunday, 3/22 a resident on the 800 block of Parkes Run Lane reports discovering someone entered their vehicle overnight. The glove box contents were thrown around the vehicle. The vehicle was unlocked and nothing was taken. The Radnor Police strongly advise everyone to lock all vehicles and keep valuables out of sight. Please call 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY with any information about this incident or when reporting any suspicious activities.

Radnor Police received a call on Monday 3/23 at approx. 01:25 hrs for a possible burglary in progress in the 100 block of E Lancaster Av. Police were advised 3 persons were seen climbing onto the roof of the businesses in that area. Officers setup a perimeter after 2 bottles were thrown in their direction from the roof. With the assistance of RFC and Haverford Twp Police, 3 males were taken into custody. All were charged with Criminal Trespass, Loitering and Prowling at night, and UAD.

Over night between 3/23/2020 and 3/24/2020 several vehicles, at least five, were entered both on Williams Rd. and Wentworth La. Officers have taken at least five reports of various items being taken from unlocked vehicles on both Williams Rd. and Wentworth La. Radnor Police are requesting any residents who may have video coverage of the area, to review their video for any suspicious persons, vehicles, or activities that may have been recorded. If any video is obtained you are asked to call the Radnor Police at 911. Also if you may have seen anything suspicious or were the victim of a similar type crime you are asked to call the Radnor Police at 911.

There is a low flying helicopter in the area of Conestoga Rd. and Countyline Rd. Officials are conducting visual inspection of the high powered lines in the area. We are aware of the helicopters presence, but we do not know how long they will be in the area.

On Wednesday, 3/25/2020, a retail theft occurred at the Wawa store located at 201 Bryn Maw Av. The store manager reports that a black male, approximately 6' tall, last seen wearing an Amazon uniform, an Amazon hat and a yellow reflective vest, left the store without paying for approximately \$10.00 worth of items. The actor was last seen as the passenger in a white box truck, that ran a red light and drove into Lower Merion Township on Bryn Mawr Av. If anyone may have seen anything at this time they are asked to call the Radnor Police at 911.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.



<u>LEGISLATION:</u> Resolution #2020-54: Awarding the Contract for Construction Consulting Services for the Roberts Road Culvert to Gannett Fleming, Incorporated in the Amount of \$32,466.

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY: The Roberts Road Culvert Construction Project was previously awarded by the Commissioners to Loftus Construction Company.

<u>PURPOSE AND EXPLANATION</u>: Gannett Fleming was previously awarded the contract for design and construction consulting services. During the design process, changes were made, and more importantly, the Gannett Fleming structural engineer was onsite many times to ensure the culvert was safe, while we went through the permitting process. These many inspections used funds in the original contract that was meant for construction consulting services. The Gannett Fleming proposal is attached.

<u>IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE</u>: It is anticipated that the Roberts Road Culvert Construction project will begin April 28th, 2020. Pending Board approval, Gannett Fleming's contract will begin at that time.

Exhibit "A"

- 1. Grantor hereby grants to Grantee a perpetual non-exclusive easement upon and across that certain strip of land situate on the Property identified on the Plans attached as Exhibit "B" (the "Trail Easement Area") for the use of non-motorized recreational uses such as follows: walking, jogging and bicycling subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) Equestrian use of the trail shall be prohibited.
- (b) Access to the Trail Easement Area by the general public shall be subject to the rules, regulations and/or limitations established by Grantee and approved by Grantor to regulate trail activities ("Access Restrictions") and there shall always be a prohibition on the use of motorized vehicles except in the case of emergency or in connection with the construction, maintenance or patrol of the Trail Easement Area or by persons who need to use motor-driven wheelchairs.
 - (c) Grantee shall be solely responsible for enforcement of the Access Restrictions.
- (d) Grantee shall maintain the Trail Easement Area free and clear of all garbage, litter and debris.
- (e) Grantor shall provide written notice to Grantee in the event that any Access Restrictions are being violated and Grantee shall promptly take immediate steps to enforce the Access Restrictions.
- (f) Grantee agrees, at its sole expense, to construct and erect signage approved by Grantor and any other necessary public safety improvements as determined by Grantor or Grantee upon or within the Trail Easement Area. Grantee shall continuously maintain such improvements in good condition and repair.
- 2. No permanent barriers, fences, signs or other obstructions to the free and unhampered use of the trail and the Trail Easement Area shall hereafter be permitted by Grantor, nor shall any buildings or other permanent structures be permitted or constructed by Grantor within any portion of the Trail Easement Area without the express written approval of Grantee.
- 3. This Agreement constitutes an easement to a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for recreational purposes, and accordingly, the parties intend for the Grantor to be entitled to the protections provided to an owner of land under the Pennsylvania Recreational Use of Land and Water Act, 68 P.S. § 477-1 et. seq.
- 4. This easement is for the benefit of Grantee, its successors and assigns, and is appurtenant thereto and shall run with the Property.
- 5. Grantee shall carry, at its own cost and expense, commercial general liability insurance with a minimum limit of liability of \$1,000,000.00 combined, single limit for bodily injury or death/property damage arising out of any one occurrence. Grantee shall name Grantor

injury or death/property damage arising out of any one occurrence. Grantee shall name Grantor as an additional insured under its commercial general liability policy. Grantee shall provide a certificate of insurance adding Grantor as an additional insured within thirty (30) days of the execution of this Agreement, and annually thereafter for as long as the easement remains in effect. Grantee shall notify Grantor at least thirty (30) days in advance if Grantee's insurance is cancelled or non-renewed for any reason. To the extent permitted by law, and without waiving governmental immunity, recreational land use immunities and all other applicable immunities, which immunities are preserved by the Grantee in all respects. Grantee, for itself and its successors and assigns, shall and hereby agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Grantor (and Grantor's directors, officers, employees, successors and assigns) from all costs, losses, damages and expenses, including, without limitation, attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from any loss of life or property or injury or damage to any person or the property of any person or entity (including, without limitation, the Grantor) and from and against any and all claims, demands, or actions for such loss, death, injury or damage in any manner arising out of or resulting from or connected with occurrences in or public use of the trail or the Trail Easement Area or Grantee's, or Grantee's employees', agents', contractors', or invitees' construction, maintenance, repair or use of the trail or the Trail Easement Area, provided that nothing contained herein shall require Grantee to indemnify Grantor against matters resulting from the gross negligence or willful acts or omissions of Grantor or its employees or agents.

- 6. To the extent that the construction of the Trail Easement Area increases the impervious surface ratio on Grantor's property, any increase in Grantor's stormwater management fee payable to the Township shall be reimbursed to Grantor by Grantee within thirty (30) days of presentation of a statement or invoice therefor. If any increase in impervious surface on Grantor's property adversely impacts future development or re-development of Grantor's property, Grantee shall grant and/or actively support such land development or zoning relief as is requested by Grantor in order to eliminate or remove any such adverse impact on Grantor's property.
- 7. Termination of Temporary and Permanent Easements. The Temporary Construction Easement and the pedestrian and bicycle Trail Easement granted herein shall automatically terminate and expire and be of no further force or effect, without the requirement of further action by either Grantor or Grantee, if construction of the trail and all related improvements to be installed within the Trail Easement Area is not completed within five (5) years of the date of recording this Agreement or if this Agreement is not recorded by Grantee within one (1) year of the date it is fully executed by the parties.
- 8. Grantee shall commence construction of the trail after design of the trail by Grantee, and approval of all design and construction plans for the trail by Grantor, and execution of the Trail Easement by both parties. In construction of the trail, Grantee shall not disturb the existing cross country trail on the Property currently used by the School District students unless the trail needs to be relocated. If the cross country trail needs to be relocated Grantee will

provide and maintain continuous use and access by Grantor to the relocated trail. If the trail replaces or interferes with any portion of the cross country trail, Grantor shall be permitted to use that portion of the trail for practices and competition, including the right to close the trail to public use briefly during competitions.


- 9. No Representation by Grantor. The proposed easement to be granted is subject to all title encumbrances of record and subject to all existing conditions of the Trail Easement Area. Grantee is not relying on any representations, information or promises made or supplied by Grantor or its representatives as to the condition of the Trail Easement Area, its suitability for Grantee's intended use, or any other matter.
- with the construction, maintenance or repair of the Trail Easement Area. The Grantee shall prepare construction plans, specifications and details that must meet applicable Pennsylvania Department of Transportation standards and applicable Federal Highway Administration standards. The Grantor shall have the right to review and approve all plans and specifications for the trail, stormwater management facilities, lighting, signage, and any personal property to be placed along the trail or within the Trail Easement Area. Prior to commencing any construction within the Trail Easement Area, Grantee shall:
 - (a) Provide Grantor with at least 30 days' prior written notice.
 - (b) Obtain and deliver to Grantor certificates evidencing comprehensive general liability insurance coverage with respect to Grantee (in accordance with paragraph 9 below) and all persons entering the Trail Easement Area for the purpose of construction.
 - (c) Obtain, at Grantee's cost and expense, all permits and approvals by applicable governmental authorities required for the construction.
- 11. Nonexclusive Use; No assignment. Grantee shall have the nonexclusive use of the Trail Easement Area in common with Grantor. Grantor reserves the right to utilize and grant other rights to the Trail Easement Area, provided Grantor's right to utilize and/or grant rights with respect to the Trail Easement Area shall not be inconsistent with or adversely affect the rights granted herein. Grantee shall be prohibited from conveying, assigning, leasing, subleasing or otherwise transferring all or any of its rights or obligations hereunder to any other person or entity. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantee shall be permitted to engage a contractor or subcontractor to perform its trail maintenance and repair responsibilities required by this Agreement.
- 12. Maintenance; Restoration. The maintenance, repair, restoration and care of the trail and the Trail Easement Area shall be the sole responsibility of Grantee. Grantee shall also comply with and conform to all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations, rules and ordinances pertaining to the trail and the Trail Easement Area and Grantee's exercise of the rights herein conferred, and Grantee shall maintain and keep the trail and the Trail Easement Area in good, safe and reasonably attractive condition. Grantee, at its expense, shall promptly repair and/or restore any property or improvements, including landscaping, which have been disturbed


or damaged in connection with the exercise or use of Grantee's rights herein granted, to the same or substantially similar condition as existed prior to such disturbance or damage. In the event that trees are removed at the corner of King of Prussia Road and Route 30, Grantee shall provide minimum 3.5" caliper replacement trees in accordance with the Township's Shade Tree Ordinance. Grantee shall replace any trees or plantings planted by Grantee that die within eighteen (18) months of being planted. Prior to removal of any trees, a landscaping plan prepared by Grantee shall be reviewed and approved by Grantor, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, delayed or conditioned by Grantor.


- 13. Public Safety Improvements. Grantee agrees, at its sole expense, to construct and erect signage approved by Grantor and any other necessary public safety improvements, as determined by Grantor or Grantee upon or within the Trail Easement Area. Grantee shall continuously maintain such improvements in good condition and repair.

Grantor and Grantee will meet to discuss the construction and installation of a shade structure in an area to be designated by Grantor near the intersection of Lancaster Avenue and King of Prussia Road. To the extent permitted by law, and without waiving governmental immunity, recreational land use immunities and all other applicable immunities, which immunities are preserved by the Grantee in all respects, Grantee for itself and its successors and assigns, shall and hereby agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Grantor (and Grantor's directors, officers, employees, successors and assigns) from all costs, losses, damages and expenses, including, without limitation, attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from any loss of life or property or injury or damage to any person or the property of any person or entity (including, without limitation, the Grantor) and from and against any and all claims, demands, or actions for such loss, death, injury or damage in any manner arising out of or resulting from or connected with occurrences in or public use of the trail or the Trail Easement Area or Grantee's or Grantee's employees', agents', contractors', or invitees' construction, maintenance, repair or use of the trail or the Trail Easement Area, provided that nothing contained herein shall require Grantee to indemnify Grantor against matters resulting from the gross negligence or willful acts or omissions of Grantor or its employees or agents.
- 16. Relocation/Modification Rights. Grantor reserves the right, in its sole and absolute discretion and at its sole cost, including construction costs, to relocate or modify the Trail Easement Area provided that Grantee is provided with substantially similar rights in the relocated or modified easement and such relocated or modified easement can be used in a similar


manner as the original easement. In the event that Grantor exercises its relocation or modification rights, Grantor shall provide Grantee with at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of such relocation or modification and a revised Easement approved by the parties shall be recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in and for Delaware County, Pennsylvania evidencing the relocated or modified easement.


- 17. To the extent that the construction of the Trail Easement Area increases the impervious surface ratio on Grantor's property, any increase in Grantor's stormwater management fee payable to the Township shall be reimbursed to Grantor by Grantee within thirty (30) days of presentation of a statement or invoice therefor. If any increase in impervious surface on Grantor's property adversely impacts future development or re-development of Grantor's property, Grantee shall grant and/or actively support such land development or zoning relief as is requested by Grantor in order to eliminate or remove any such adverse impact on Grantor's property.
- 18. Grantor shall approve the final engineered plans and specifications for the trail and the Trail Easement Area prior to commencement of construction. The use of the trail within the Trail Easement Area shall function in the same way as a public sidewalk. Grantee shall provide for snow clearing of the trail at its expense in accordance with the same standards, procedures and conditions as other Township sidewalks during snow conditions.
- 19. The trail and the Trail Easement Area shall be the minimum width necessary to accomplish its purpose; however, in no event shall the easement area (temporary and permanent) exceed twenty (20) feet in width unless required by some township, state or federal ordinance, statute or regulation. In the event of such requirement, the Township will seek relief from such requirement and make its best effort to maintain the easement width to twenty (20) feet.
- 20. Termination of Easement Agreement. This Agreement shall automatically terminate and expire and be of no further force or effect, without the requirement of further action by either Grantor or Grantee, if construction of the trail and all related improvements to be installed within the Trail Easement Area is not completed within five (5) years of the date of recording this easement agreement.



























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








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








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



