3. Township Manager Recognition of Radnor Police Department

Mr. Zienkowski briefly spoke that on Thursday, March 28, 2019 Radnor Police along with many other agencies were called to the Wawa on Sugartown Road with reports of a shooting. Upon entering it was discovered that there was one fatality and no other injuries. I would like to commend the Radnor Police under the direction of Superintendent Flanagan along with the other agencies for their professionalism and swift work in a very difficult and tragic incident.

4. Announcement of Boards and Commission Vacancies

Commissioner Larkin announced the following vacancies: Board of Health - 1 Vacancy (unexpired term 12/31/19); Citizens Audit Review & Financial Advisory Committee - 6 Vacancies; Code Appeals Board - 1 Vacancy - Requirements: Master Electrician, Master Plumber or General Contractor; Rental Housing Appeals Board - 1 Vacancy (unexpired term 12/31/2022); Stormwater Management Advisory Committee - 4 Vacancies.

5. Committee Reports

PARKS & RECREATION

- A. Ordinance #2019-04 (Adoption) Authorizing an Addendum to the Lease Agreement by and Between Radnor Township School District and Radnor Township for the Property Known as Emlen Tunnell Park
 Tammy Cohen, Director of Recreation and Community Programming briefly explained the above ordinance.
 Commissioner Farhy made a motion to adopt, seconded by Commissioner Nagle. Commissioner Borowski called the vote, motion passed 7-0.
- B. <u>Resolution #2019-34- Authorizing the Purchase of a Comfort Station for Emlen Tunnell Park</u> Commissioner Farhy made a motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Nagle.

Tammy Cohen, Director of Recreation and Community Programming briefly explained the above resolution. There was a brief discussion amongst the Commissioners.

Mr. Norcini explained Request is being made to authorize the Township to purchase a comfort station that would subsequently be installed at Emlen Tunnell Park (upon Board authorization of construction award of bid). This purchase would be made from Romtec Pre-Engineered Buildings through the Pennsylvania State Purchasing Contract (COSTARS). Installation will be bid subsequently to this resolution and will later appear before the Board of Commissioners for approval. Romtec is a single-source design, engineering, and manufacturer who will supply the construction drawings and full building kit as a complete, pre-designed packaged building to be constructed on site. Romtec is a highly-regarded company with 40 years of experience in packaged building supply and construction.

Commissioner Borowski called the vote, motion passed 7-0.

PUBLIC WORKS & ENGINEERING

C. <u>Discussion and Possible Motion regarding the corner area landscaping, tree replacement and paving of adjacent street parking in the Wayne Business Overlay District</u>

Commissioner Larkin made a motion to table the street paving, plantings and trees until the April 29th meeting. There was no second. There was a discussion amongst the Commissioners and staff.

Commissioner Nagle made a motion to approve spending up to \$25K for a downsized plan for plantings in the WBOD pending confirmation from the RECT of funding the full project, seconded by Commissioner Borowski.

Public Comment

Sara Pilling, Garrett Avenue – She commented on the suggested plantings.

Commissioner Borowski called the vote, motion passed 7-0.

PERSONNEL & ADMINISTRATION

D. <u>Resolution #2019-22 - Adopting the Goal Setting Report of The Organizational Resources Group Dated</u>

March 20, 2019

Commissioner Clark made a motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Nagle.

There was an in-depth discussion amongst the Commissioners.

Commissioner Larkin made a motion to item 1 of the resolution "funding mechanism" he would like changed to "funding mechanisms for long-term capital and infrastructure projects"; also combining item 3 and 4 to include long-term funding mechanisms for all Township Emergency Services, seconded by Commissioner Nagle

Public Comment

Sara Pilling, Garrett Avenue – She commented regarding the public able to attend past goal setting sessions.

Commissioner Borowski called the vote on the amended motion, motion failed 2-4 with Commissioners Booker, Farhy, Clark and Abel opposed and Commissioner Nagle absent.

There was more discussion amongst the Board.

Commissioner Borowski called the vote on the original motion to approve, motion failed 1-5 with Commissioners Booker, Farhy, Clark, Larkin and Abel opposed and Commissioner Nagle absent.

E. <u>Discussion of Emergency Communications</u>

Superintendent Flanagan reviewed the discussions that Delaware County is having on the modifications of the Emergency Communications system for the County that need to take place over the next couple years and the modifications that Radnor will need to take as well. There was a brief discussion amongst the Commissioner, Solicitor and staff.

F. Solicitor Review of the CICD

Mr. Rice briefly reviewed the CICD ordinance and the items that are included. There was a discussion amongst the Commissioners and staff regarding lighting, parking, uses, etc.
