

**RESOLUTION NO. 2010-10**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RADNOR, DELAWARE COUNTY,  
PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING A CITIZENS BUDGET AND FINANCE  
ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO ADVISE AND REPORT TO THE BOARD OF  
COMMISSIONERS OF RADNOR TOWNSHIP ON ISSUES CONCERNING THE  
TOWNSHIP BUDGET AND FINANCES**

*WHEREAS*, municipal budgets throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania have been severely impacted by the national economic downturn; and

*WHEREAS*, Radnor Township's municipal budget has been negatively impacted by a reduction in real estate and Act 511 taxes; and

*WHEREAS*, the Board of Commissioners has determined that a Citizens Budget and Finance Advisory Committee should be established to address budget and financial issues which arise on an annual basis in Radnor Township.

*NOW, THEREFORE*, be it hereby *RESOLVED* that the Board of Commissioners does hereby establish a Citizens Budget and Finance Advisory Committee (CBFAC) to develop recommendations for the Board of Commissioners to improve the financial position of the Township in accordance with the following guidelines:


1. The CBFAC shall consist of nine (9) volunteer township residents, to be approved by the Board of Commissioners for a term of one (1) year.
2. The initial goals of the CBFAC shall be as follows:
  - a. Promote public participation in the township budgeting process, and a minimum of two (2) public meetings shall be held by the Committee;
  - b. Review operating expenses and long-term liabilities in order to make strategic recommendations for the 2011 budget, including measures to address unfunded leave liabilities of the Township;
  - c. Review revenue estimates to ensure alignment with the 2011 budget, benchmarking potential enhancement strategies and opportunities, which may include, but not be limited to user fees for services;
  - d. Perform analysis of existing township services and programs as directed by the Board;

- e. Develop recommendations relating to township infrastructure and public and private investment;
- f. Make recommendations regarding capital funding and expenditures, and suggestions as to how best to maximize Township assets; and
- g. Produce a written final report of observations, analysis, and strategic recommendations to the Board of Commissioners. The final report is to be submitted to the Board of Commissioners by October 15, 2010.
