C 683 Conestoga Road – 5 Heritage Trees

- All 5 trees are heritage – 3 Maple, 2 Poplar, 1 Poplar in the front is not a hazardous tree
- Commission would like to advocate to save the Poplar in the front
 - Resident has the option of Keeping the tree, removing the Poplar tree and replacing it with 6 trees, 4 being canopy trees, or provide township with \$1,500 for tree replacements elsewhere in the township.

The Radnor Township Shade Tree Commission recommendation: 4 trees to be removed; 1 poplar in front of house should be pruned and saved. Resident does have the option to remove it and plant 6 trees (4 being canopy), or pay the township \$1,500 for the trees to be planted within Radnor Township.

2019 Radnor Township Shade Tree Committee Goals – 20Mar2019

Notes in blue; Actions in Red.

- 1) Implement the Master Street Tree Charter – *Matt & Eileen*
 - a. Complete the tree inventory as proposed in the charter. - Matt
 - b. Address gaps by offering both Spring & Fall Plantings of both large and small trees.
 - c. Spring Planting Notes:
 - i. Trees to be quoted – Quote 5 and 10 of each for a total of 35 and 70 trees.
 1. Small Trees:
 - a. Rutgers Dogwood
 - b. Redbud
 - c. Magnolia
 2. Large Canopy Trees:
 - a. Red Maple
 - b. Bi-Color Oak
 - c. Willow Oak
 - d. Black Gum
 - ii. Tree Sizes to be provided by John Hosbach to Steve Norcini for the bid.
 - iii. Timeline to be shared with Steve Norcini:
 1. BOC to award contract no later than April 29th.
 2. All work to be completed by May 30th.
 - iv. **ACTION: Complete communication – Ginny (great job already!):**
 1. Work with Kimberley Donches to modify flyer as discussed.
 2. Publicize via BOC newsletters, Township Website, Radnor Conservancy.
 3. Edit registration link/page to allow residents to select a small or large tree and list their preference if any.
- 2) Keep the Ordinance Current and Effective – *Joe*
 - a. Implement Bamboo Ordinance – We aligned on the following:
 - i. Existing bamboo to be maintained (grandfathered in).
 - ii. No new plantings.
 - iii. Fines subjective to review by the Township Arborist.
 - iv. No burning of bamboo.
 - v. Rationale for why to be included in ordinance.
 - vi. **ACTION: Author paragraph – John; Present to BOC - Eileen**
 - b. Help residents, developers and contractors follow the ordinance via #3.
 - c. Update ordinance - Joe
- 3) Serve our Residents via Proactive Communication – *James, Joe, Ginny*
 - a. Have communications go live on the Radnor Township Website
 - b. Increase Education and Awareness to help keep and improve Radnor’s Tree Canopy
 - c. Make it easy to obtain advise on existing trees of concern to keep everyone safe.
 - d. Advise residents during construction projects on how to protect existing trees.
 - e. Provide input on Key Issues (e.g. EAB, spotted lantern flies).
 - f. Storm and Electrical Line concerns
 - i. **ACTION: Talk to PECO/Cable Comcast about tree trimming practices. Joe Blackburn is the liaison. Jake Abel, 6th Ward BOC is pursuing.**
