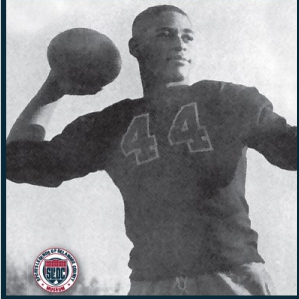

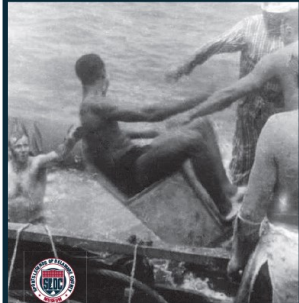
A TRUE AMERICAN HERO AND LEGEND!

RADNOR HIGH SCHOOL ALL TIME GREAT



THE AMBITION OF EVERY YOUNG CHILD IN THE GARRETT HILL SECTION OF RADNOR TOWNSHIP WAS TO PLAY SOMEDAY FOR THE RADNOR RED RAIDERS. EMLLEN TUNNELL WAS NO DIFFERENT. FOR ALL FOUR YEARS OF HIS HIGHSCHOOL CAREER (1938-1941), EMLLEN WOULD NOT ONLY STAR ON VARSITY DEFENSE BUT HE WOULD BE RADNOR'S BEST RUNNER AND PASSER. DURING HIS JUNIOR AND SENIOR YEAR, HE WAS NAMED TO THE ALL-DELCO, ALL-SUBURAN, ALL-SCHOLASTIC, AND ALL-STATE TEAMS.

CROSSING THE EQUATOR



EMLLEN TUNNELL SERVED IN THE US COAST GUARD DURING WORLD WAR II. WHILE IN THE SERVICE HE EARNED HIGH HONORS WITH THE SILVER LIFE SAVING MEDAL, AS WELL AS THE COMBAT ACTION RIBBON.

THE SILVER LIFE SAVING MEDAL IS A U.S. DECORATION ISSUED BY THE U.S. COAST GUARD. THE AWARD WAS FIRST ESTABLISHED BY AN ACT OF CONGRESS IN 1874.

THE MEDAL WAS BESTOWED UPON ANY PERSONS WHO ENDANGERED THEIR OWN LIVES IN SAVING OR ENDEAVORING TO SAVE LIVES FROM THE PERILS OF THE SEA. EMLLEN WAS TWICE CITED FOR ACTS OF HEROISM DURING HIS SERVICE. IN 1944, WHILE ABOARD THE USS ETAMIN, A JAPANESE TORPEDO BLEW A HOLE IN THE SIDE OF THE SHIP. TUNNELL CAME TO THE AID OF SHIPMATE FRED SHAVER WHO WAS ON FIRE. HE ALSO SAVED THE LIFE OF ANOTHER MAN IN 1946, WHEN SHIPMATE AL GIVENS FELL OVERBOARD INTO 32-DEGREE WATER. GIVENS WOULD HAVE DROWNED IF TUNNELL HAD NOT JUMED INTO THE WATER TO HIS RESCUE.

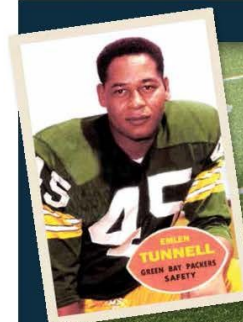
SILVER LIFE SAVING MEDAL

EMLLEN TUNNELL EARNED NFL CHAMPIONSHIPS AS A DEFENSIVE BACK FOR THE NEW YORK GIANTS IN 1956 AND THE GREEN BAY PACKERS IN 1961 AND WAS SELECTED NINE TIMES TO THE PRO BOWL. EMLLEN IS CELEBRATED AS THE FIRST FULL-TIME AFRICAN AMERICAN ASSISTANT COAST AND MOST NOTABLE AS THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN AND FIRST DEFENSIVE PLAYER ENSHRINED IN THE PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME IN 1967.

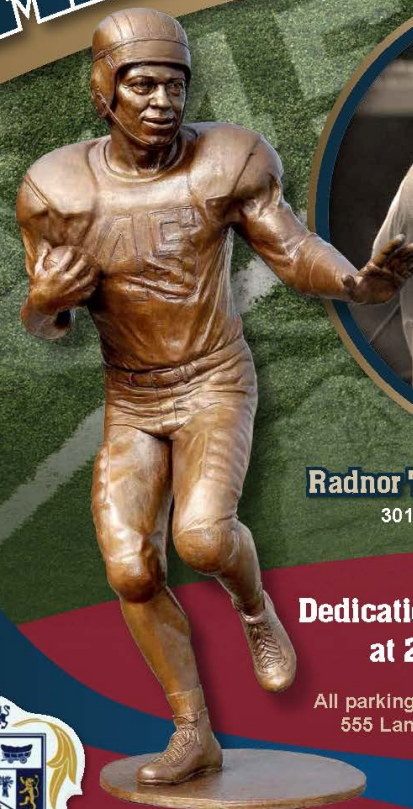

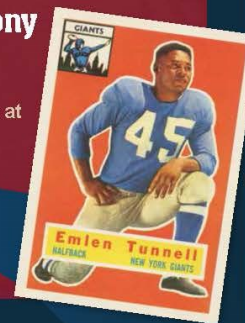
