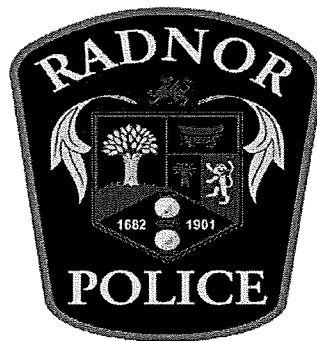

CRIME ALERTS
NOVEMBER 2021

The Radnor Township Police Department has issued a crime alert in reference to a theft of a wallet. The theft, which was reported on 10/29/21, occurred at a commercial property in the 500 block of E Lancaster Ave., while the victim was shopping. Please call 9-1-1 with any information in regard to this incident or when reporting suspicious activities.

Sometime between 10/31/2021 and 11/1/2021 a resident of the unit block of Garrett Av. had their bicycle stolen. The bike was a black hybrid style with an orange basket attached to the rear. The actual make of the bike is not known.

Overnight between 11/4/2021 and 11/5/2021 several vehicles were entered and had items stolen from them. The incidents occurred in the area of Abrahams Lane and an arrest was made of a subject with evidence tying them to at least one of the thefts. All vehicles were left unlocked at the time of the thefts.

On Friday, 11/5/2021 at approximately 6:20 PM, a resident of the unit block of Lowry's Lane had items stolen from their front porch. The victim's ring camera showed an Asian male in his early 20s wearing dark jacket, white undershirt, and black sweatpants with a white stripe, walk onto the porch and remove a candle holder of unknown value.

Sometime over night between 11/5/2021 and 11/6/2021, a resident of the 500 block of W. Beechtree Lane reports trash and debris thrown on their front yard. "Wawa" mobile ordering signs, empty beer cans and orange traffic cones were thrown on the front lawn of the residence.

Sometime overnight, between 11/6/2021 and 11/7/2021, a resident of the 100 block of S. Ithan Av. reports the fence to their property was damaged. The damaged consisted of broken post and rails valued at approximately \$300.00 to \$500.00 dollars.

On Saturday, 10/30/2021, the Farmer's Market security video captured the theft of a stuffed animal from the Bella Donna booth. Video captured a white female with a small child take the stuffed animal and exit the Farmer's Market. The video shows the female and child leave the parking lot in a white Toyota Highlander with an unknown PA registration.

On Wednesday, 11/10/2021, the resident of the 100 block of Pine Tree Rd. reports they have not received mail in two days.

On Thursday, 11/11/2021 at approximately 9:12 PM the resident from the unit block of Fairview Av. reported criminal mischief to their residence. The resident advises that their home was just egged.

Witnesses reported a catalytic converter stolen from a brown Honda CR-V that was parked in the lot of 1030 E. Lancaster Av. on Friday, 11/12/2021 at 2:44 PM. Thanks to information received from witnesses an arrest warrant has been issued for a subject responsible for this theft.

On Friday, 11/12/2021, between 9:30 AM and 3:20 PM, the victim reports the catalytic converter was removed from their vehicle while it was parked in the Septa Lot located at 99 Matsonford Rd.

Sometime over night between 11/13/2021 and 11/14/2021, a resident of the 500 block of W. Beechtree Lane had an egg thrown at their home. The egg struck the front window of the residence.

On Monday, 11/15/2021, a resident of the 100 block of Morningside Circle reports a political sign in their front yard was vandalized. The resident reports the sign had a black swastika painted on it.

The Radnor Township Police Department has issued a crime alert in reference to a theft of a catalytic converter. The theft occurred sometime between November 18th and 19th in an apartment complex parking lot in the 1000 block of E Lancaster Ave. Please call 9-1-1 with any information in regard to this incident or when reporting suspicious activities.

The Radnor Township Police Department has issued a crime alert in reference to criminal mischief to a vehicle. The incident occurred on 11/19/21 at a commercial parking lot in the 200 block of E Lancaster Ave. The victim reported their front window was damaged and the side of the vehicle was dented likely by a brick that had been lying beside the car. Please call 9-1-1 with any information in regard to this incident or when reporting suspicious activities.

The Radnor Township Police Department has issued a crime alert in reference to a theft from a vehicle. Radnor Police received an anonymous complaint on 11/22/21 that a catalytic converter was stolen from a vehicle between 11/14/21 and 11/20/21 while it was parked in the unit block of Aldwyn Lane. The complainant discovered the theft after taking the vehicle in for servicing. Please call 9-1-1 with any information in regard to this incident or when reporting suspicious activities.

On Wednesday, 11/24/2021, a low flying helicopter has been reported in the Wayne Area, specifically above the rail lines. This aircraft has nothing to do with law enforcement and there is no concern to the general public. The helicopter is reportedly doing surveillance of the rail lines (maintenance surveillance) for Amtrak.

On Thursday, 11/25/2021, the resident of the 600 block of Brookside Av. reports their home was burglarized. Forced entry was made into the home through a window. The resident reports the burglary occurred sometime between the hours of 5:45 PM and 10:38 PM. Several items of value were removed from the residence.

The Radnor Police have issued a traffic alert due to RT 476 having been shut down in the southbound direction - it is now open. An accident involving an overturned tractor trailer had occurred on Rt 476 within the borders of Radnor Township. As a result, all southbound traffic was being diverted off of the Blue Route at the Radnor interchange. Traffic can now get through though delays remain on the southbound side of Rt 476.

On 11/27/2021, the resident from the 200 block of Landover Rd. reports a theft from their vehicle. The victim reports an undetermined amount of money was removed from their unlocked vehicle.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.



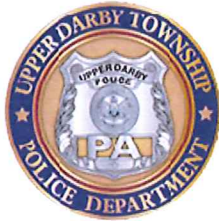

Dear Superintendent Flanagan,

The Upper Darby Township Narcotics Unit was conducting an ongoing investigation into numerous individuals who were selling narcotics throughout the township and were known to carry firearms. On Wednesday, November 10, 2021 members of the Upper Darby Township Narcotics Unit and the Mountain Bike Unit, attempted to take two of the males into custody, at which time one male fled from police on foot, through a crowded Foot Locker store. Officers observed the male reaching for his waistband while fleeing from police into the back storage room. The male discarded a firearm prior to police taking him into custody in the back storage room, which has numerous aisles and rows of shoeboxes and inventory.

Upper Darby Police requested the assistance of Radnor Township Police Department Officer Brett Greaves #98 and his K9 partner Onyx. They responded to search the overwhelmingly large storage area for the discarded firearm. Officer Greaves and K9 Onyx welcomed the challenge.

Officer Greaves and his partner K9 Onyx, began searching the area. A short time later, K9 Onyx alerted on a specific shoebox which revealed a fully loaded black Taurus G3c, 9mm handgun, with altered serial number and a laser/light accessory.

Without the help of Officer Greaves and K9 Onyx, this fully loaded firearm may not have ever been located by police and could have ended up in the wrong hands. The Upper Darby Police Department greatly appreciates The Radnor Township Police Department and the excellent work and service of Officer Greaves and K9 Onyx.
