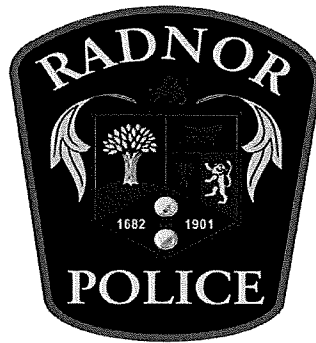

**Theft of Wallet - 550 E. Lancaster Av. - Giant Parking Lot**

On Monday, 2/12/2024 at approximately 12:49 PM the victim had their wallet taken from the parking lot of the Giant Store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av. The victim reports they dropped their wallet while exiting their vehicle in the parking lot. After discovering that the wallet was missing, store security reviewed the security video. Video revealed that an unknown subject picked up the wallet outside of the victim's vehicle shortly after it was dropped.

**Suspicious person/Vehicle - Radnor Middle School - 150 Louella Av.**

On Friday, 2/9/2024, at approximately 5:00 PM, a suspicious vehicle was observed at Radnor Middle School, 150 Louella Av. The vehicle is described as a small black car, like a sports car, with a "felt" top. The operator of the vehicle was a white male, approximately 50-60 years of age.

**Crime Alert - Burglary**

The Radnor Police are investigating a residential burglary which occurred sometime between 02/13/2024, time unknown and 02/16/20204 at 1100 hours in the 600 block of Jefferson Road. Force entry was made to a rear door. Several items were taken, including a firearm. Anyone experiencing similar incidents or who may have additional information is asked to contact the Radnor Police by dialing 911.

**Theft of License Plates - 100 block of Buckingham Rd.**

On Monday, 2/19/2024, at approximately 6:14 PM the resident of the 100 block of Rockingham Rd. reported the license plates were stolen from their vehicle. The vehicle was parked in front of their residence at 8:20 AM and when they returned to their car at 5:00 PM, the license plates were gone.

**Retail Theft - 550 E. Lancaster Av. - Home Sense Store**

On 2/20/2024, the Home Sense Store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av. reported a retail theft that had occurred on 2/9/2024 at approximately 5:50 PM. At that time two black males exited the store with a shopping cart full of items without making payment.

**Retail Theft - 201 Bryn Mawr Av. the Wawa Store**

On Wednesday, 2/21/2024 at approximately 2:49 AM a retail theft occurred at the Wawa Store, located at 201 Bryn Mawr Av. Store employees advised that a black female entered the store on two separate occasions and removed items without making payment.

**Theft from Auto - 700 block of Newtown Rd.**

On Wednesday, 2/21/2024, at approximately 4:50 AM, the resident's car parked in the driveway of the 700 block of Newtown Rd. was entered and had the garage door opener stolen. The garage door was opened by unknown actors, but nothing else appears to have been taken at this time.

**Vehicle entered overnight - 700 block of Hamilton Rd.**

On Wednesday, 2/21/2024, the resident of the 700 block of Hamilton Rd. reports their vehicle was entered some time over night. The resident reports their vehicle was parked and unlocked in the driveway overnight and when they entered the vehicle in the morning the contents of the glovebox were strewn all about the vehicle. At the time of the report nothing was missing from the car.

**Vehicle Entered - 600 block of Longchamps Dr.**

On Friday, 2/23/2024 at approximately 1:21 AM a vehicle parked in a driveway of the 600 block of Longchamps Dr. was entered. Video showed an unknown person entering the unlocked vehicle but then left without taking anything.

**Theft from Vehicle - 800 block of Maple Glen La.**

Sometime between 8:00 PM on 2/22/2024 and 1:00 PM on 2/23/2024 someone stole items from a vehicle parked in a driveway in the 800 block of Maple Glen La. The unlocked vehicle had a wallet with cash and various credit cards stolen from it.

**Residential Burglary - unit block of Wistar Rd.**

A home in the unit block of Wistar Rd. was burglarized. Radnor Police were dispatched for an audible alarm to a home in the unit block of Wistar Rd. on Sunday, 2/25/2024, at approximately 9:04 PM. Officers immediately discovered forced entry into the home. While checking the interior of the residence, obvious signs of a burglary were discovered.

**Attempted Retail Theft - 550 E. Lancaster Av. - T.J. Maxx Store**

On Monday, 2/26/2024, at approximately 5:00 PM an attempted retail theft occurred at the T.J. Maxx Store located at 550 E. Lancaster Av. Store security reports a white female wearing a white hooded sweatshirt was observed attempting to leave the store with unpaid items. When confronted by store employees, the female dropped the items and fled the area on foot.

On Wednesday, February 21, 2024, at 1300 hrs. the first meeting of 2024 for Radnor's Joint Emergency Services was held in person in the Powys room of the Radnor Township building. In attendance were members of Fire, EMS, GIS, IT, and Police.

The representatives included:

**Police:** Radnor PD – Lt. Joe Pinto

**Fire:** Radnor Fire Co. - Chief Joseph Maguire, Deputy Chief Michael Maguire (virtual)  
Radnor Ambulance - Executive Director Brian Zimmerman  
Bryn Mawr Fire Co. – Chief Dan Kincade, Michael Maratea

**IT:** Bob Hale

**GIS:** David Kelly

**Emergency Management:** EM/Sgt. Christopher Gluck, A/EM Steve Giancristoforo

This meeting was held to discuss new topics and to follow up on previous items

Topics which were discussed at this meeting include the following:

- Chris Gluck (Radnor Police & OEM)
  - Discussed large scale events which have scheduled
    - Wayne Music Festival – June 8, 2024
    - Villanova Graduations – May 17 & 20, 2024
- David Kelly (GIS)
  - Discussed the current status of the trail marker project
    - At this time the trails have been identified via the GIS program
    - Trail markers are being designed by Tammy Cohen and reviewed by the Parks Board for approval



- Chief Joseph Maguire (Radnor Fire Co.)
  - Discussed the new bridge height signage on King of Prussia Rd. inquiring about the material of the signage as RFC's ladder truck may be at a height which could strike the sign causing damage to both the sign and the truck
    - It was determined that the sign should not cause damage to the truck as its height is 10'11"
    - It was noted that RFC is awaiting the arrival of a new truck which will have a height of 11'
  - Requested the incident log sheet email addresses be re-sent to all parties involved for use
  
- Deputy Chief Michael Maguire (Radnor Fire Co.)
  - Discussed concerns over the placement and height of Fire Department Connections and wished to bring this issue to the attention of Radnor's Codes Department.
    - At this time some connections have a 15-30° elbow which can reduce water flow when connecting 5" hose
    - Deputy Maguire will speak directly to the Codes Department. Andy Pancoast was advised.
  - Discussed requesting a meeting with TWP Manager White to discuss Fire & EMS staffing, Equipment, and Response times
  
- Fire Chief Dan Kincade
  - Discussed the importance of using caution tape and flares for downed trees during storms
    - All parties agreed
  
- Executive Director Brian Zimmerman
  - Expressed that a new program called "Pulse Point" will be coming to Delaware County
    - The program will connect CPR certified individuals who have the Pulse Point App with the 911 center when an emergency where they can help is nearby
      - Sgt. Gluck requested that Zimmerman provide a presentation on this topic for our next RES meeting
    - Zimmerman requested assistance with identifying the locations of AEDs within the Township so they can be noted in the Pulse Point App
  
- Steve Giancristoforo
  - Discussed the enhancement to Radnor's Tac channel and the ways it can help with communications
  - Discussed his certification as an instructor for the Association of Public Safety Communications Officials and his ability to train others to collect their own certification for emergency communications
  - Discuss the status of the cell tower which is located at 301 Iven Ave.

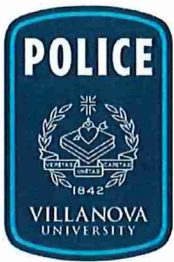

Again, thank you from the bottom of my heart. Joe's illness can be difficult, but I remind myself - he did not ask for this illness! With appreciation,

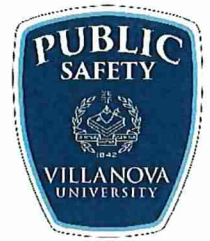

The Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General, Police Chiefs Association of Southeastern Pennsylvania, and the Bensalem Township Police Department will co-host a Civil Rights Enforcement Training for all command officers across Pennsylvania. This training will be led by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the U.S. Attorney's Office. Our federal partners will discuss the most recent hate crimes data for Pennsylvania, examine issues regarding First Amendment protected speech versus true threats, and offer best practices for addressing civil rights issues. This training will include a case study from the FBI and U.S. Attorney's office in Pittsburgh regarding the mass shooting at the Tree of Life synagogue.
