CRIME ALERTS

JULY 2024

Theft from Vehicle - 900 block of Parkes Run Lane

Over night of 7/8/2024-7/9/2024 an unlocked vehicle was entered in the 900 block of Parkes Run Lane and had money taken from the inside of the car. Video surveillance revealed that at least one additional vehicle was approached by the same actor but was not entered because it was locked. The only description of the actor was, possibly a male, wearing a dark colored hoodie and light pants.

Theft of Package - 800 block of Goshen Rd.

On 7/11/2024 the resident of the 800 block of Goshen Rd. reports a package was stolen from out front of their residence. The resident reports their video camera showed an unknown male wearing a red hoodie, take the package from out front of the residence and leave the area in a silver SUV.

Retail Theft - Old Navy - 550 E. Lancaster Av.

On Wednesday, 7/24/2024, at approximately 8:30 PM, a retail theft occurred at the Old Navy Store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av. Store employees advise that a black male and two black females removed several pairs of pants without making payment.

Retail Theft - 201 Bryn Mawr AV. Wawa Store

On Saturday, 7/27/2024 at approximately 2:00 PM a retail theft occurred at the Wawa Store located at 201 Bryn Mawr Av. Wawa staff reports, black male, last wearing a white shirt, black pants and a black hat , theft the store without paying for a undetermined number of "Redbulls."

Retail Theft - 550 E. Lancaster Av. - Home Sense Store

On Saturday, 7/27/2024, at approximately 7:25 PM a retail theft occurred at the Home Sense Store, located at 5450 E. Lancaster Av. Loss prevention Officers reported that two black females first attempted to return items that were believed to have been stolen from a different Home Sense Store. After unsuccessfully returning these items, the two females left the store with several other items that they picked up in this Home Sense without paying.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation

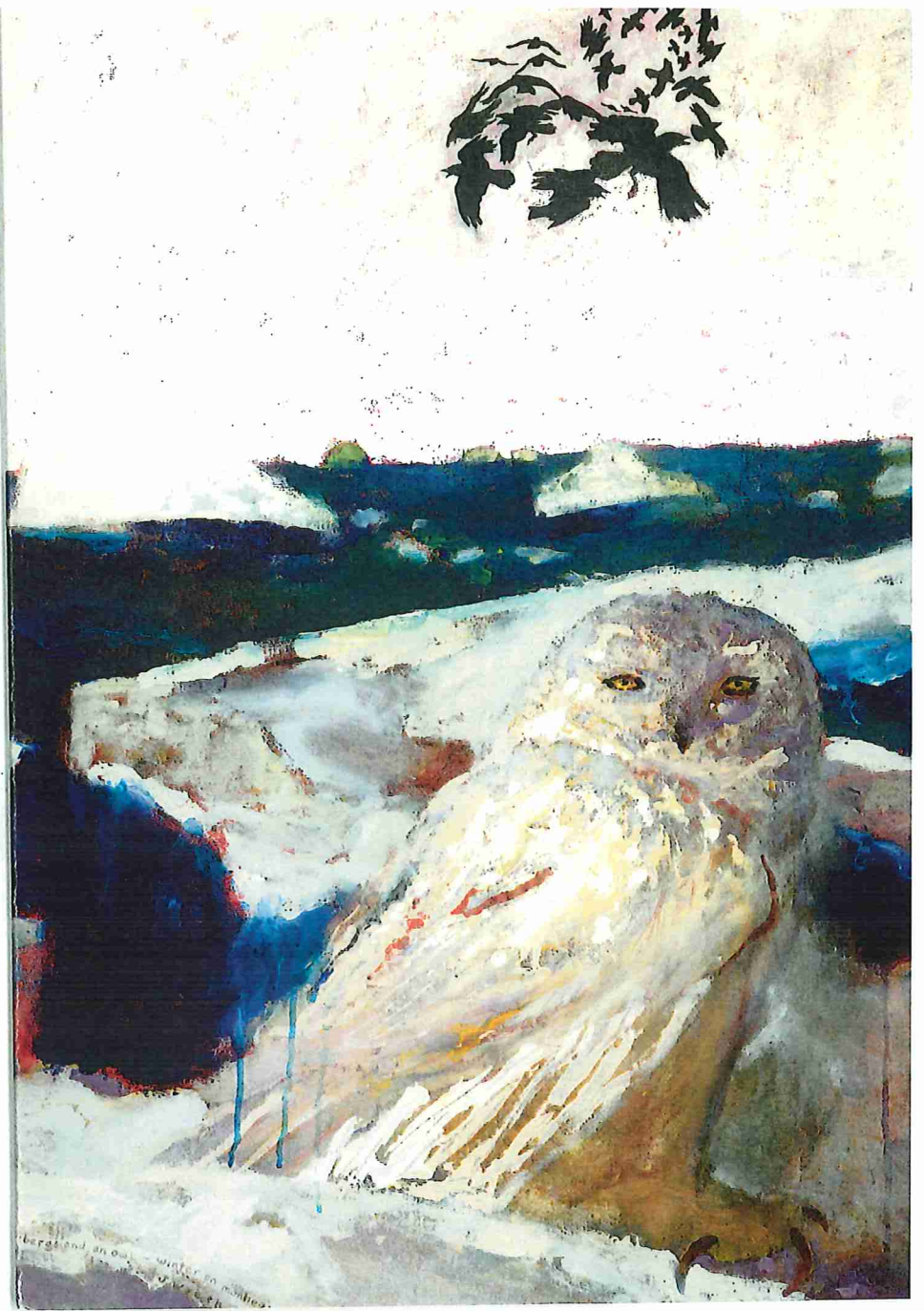

Chief Bair,

On Tuesday, July 2nd, 2024 at 0754 hours, Upper Providence Township Police were dispatched to the Media Bypass southbound at mile marker 40.4 for an accident with entrapment. Upon arrival, the first responding officer determined that the driver of the striking vehicle was deceased in the wreckage and two passengers in the same vehicle were critically injured. Both passengers in the striking vehicle were removed, however they were pronounced deceased upon the arrival of the paramedics.

While responding to the crash, one of my officers was also involved in a reportable crash, fortunately nobody was injured in this accident. I arrived at the crash shortly after dispatch and requested assistance from the Delaware County CID Crash Investigation Team. Due to the seriousness of the accident, the Media Bypass was shut down for several hours and assistance with traffic control was requested from multiple police agencies in the county.

I wanted to extend my thanks to all the Chiefs who sent crash team members to assist us on the crash investigation. I would also like to thank the Chiefs who sent officers to assist us with traffic control during this incident. Everyone handled themselves with great professionalism and I truly believe that we have some of the finest officers in the nation here in Delaware County. Please extend my thanks and gratitude to all of your officers that assisted us on this horrific accident.

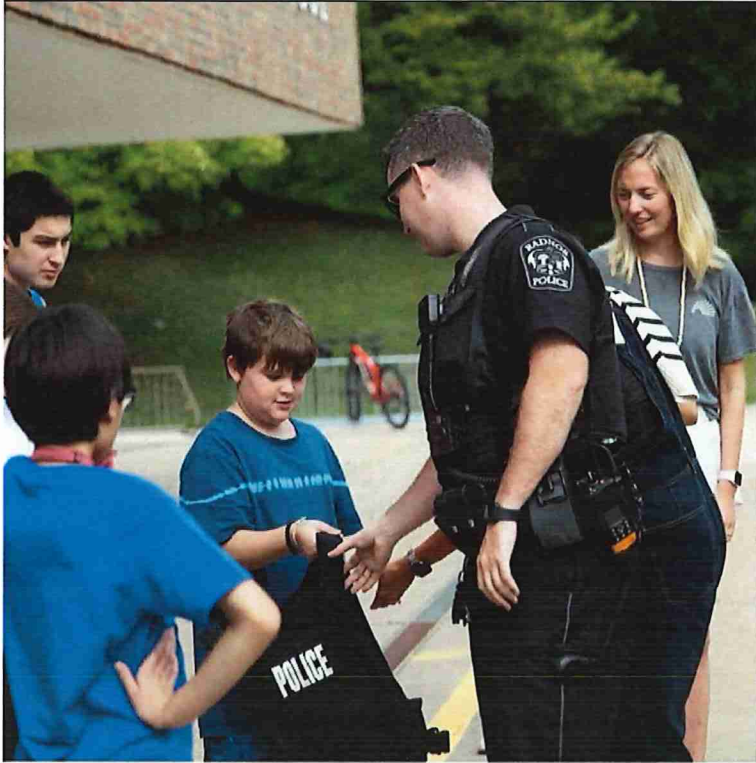
