CRIME ALERTS SEPTEMBER 2024

Criminal Mischief to Auto - 200 block of Brook St.

Sometime over night, between 8/31/2024 and 9/1/2024 a vehicle was damaged while parked in the 200 block of Brook St. The vehicle, which belongs to a resident of Brook St., had its front passenger window smashed. At this time nothing appears to have been stolen from the car.

Theft of Package - Delmont Village - 421 Morris Rd.

On Wednesday, 9/4/2025, at approximately 4:06 PM, the resident of the Delmont Village, 421 Morris Rd., had a package stolen from the the lobby area of the apartment complex. When the resident went to the lobby to retrieve her delivery, she observed a black male in his early 20's placing the package inside of a "Door Dash" delivery bag. When the resident confronted the male he ran from the apartment complex with the package.

Theft from Vehicles - Pine Tree Rd. and Hemitage Dr.

Overnight between 9/4/2024 and 9/5/2024 several vehicles were entered and had items stolen from them in the area of Pine Tree Rd. and Heritage Dr. The vehicles that were entered were parked the driveways of the victim's homes and were left unlocked at the time of the thefts.

Criminal Trespass - 300 block of Glenmary La.

On Thursday, 9/5/2024 at approximately 2:00 AM two subjects entered an open garage of a home located in the 300 block of Glenmary La. The two actors were dressed in all black and were wearing face coverings and gloves. The actors entered two unlocked vehicles parked in the garage and rifled through the contents. Both actors left the garage and entered an awaiting, unknown vehicle being operated by a third person.

Retail Theft - CVS - 316 E. Lancaster Av.

On Tuesday, 9/10/2024, at approximately 9:36 AM a retail theft occurred at the CVS, located at 316 E. Lancaster Av. The store manager reports a white female fled out the back of the store with a bag full of unknown items. She was seen leaving the area in silver Kia Sportage being operated by a separate white female.

Theft of Package - 300 block of Belrose La.

On Tuesday, 9/10/2024, at approximately 5:15 PM, a package was stolen from out from of a residence in the 300 block of Belrose La. Video shows an unknown male exit a silver van, wearing a blue t-shirt, cargo shorts, a blue baseball cap and having a tattoo on their right forearm, walk up to the package and place it under his shirt. The male then leaves the area in the van.

Theft of Mail - Radnor Township

There has been several cases of mail being stolen from inside of mailboxes from residents through out the Township. In one instance, video cameras showed a black male wearing a hood covering his face, exit a gold colored station wagon commit one of the thefts.

Vehicle Theft - 175 King of Prussia Rd. - the Racquet Ball Club

On 9/15/2024, at approximately 8:41 PM, the victim's vehicle was stolen from the parking lot of 175 King of Prussia Rd., the Racquet Club. The vehicle was left in the lot by its owner after it became disabled the day prior to it being stolen. Video shows a black male and possibly a black female enter the unlocked vehicle and after some time drive away in the car.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.







Please accept the enclosed donation and lunch to be provided as a token of our apology and appreciation for all you and your departments do.





Joint Radnor Emergency Services Meeting 2024-#3

On Wednesday, September 25, 2024, at 1300 hrs. the third meeting of 2024 for Radnor's Joint Emergency Services was held in person in the Police roll call room of the Radnor Township building. In attendance were members of Fire, EMS, Codes, IT, Police, and GIS

This meeting was held to discuss new topics and to follow up on previous items

Topics which were discussed at this meeting include the following:

- Steve Giancristoforo (OEM)
 - Discussed the status of the County radio system upgrade and the status of the radio tower located at the Radnor Township building
- Chief Michael Maguire (Radnor Fire Co.)
 - o Discussed a standpipe issue at the St. Davids shopping center
 - Codes Official Pancoast advised he would contact the property owner
 - o Discussed the use of Fire Channel 4 while within Radnor Township
 - BMFC Chief Kincade advised he will remind his staff
 - Discussed changes to vehicle code where golf carts can be considered low speed vehicles on the roadways
 - Has concerns about those vehicles getting involved in accidents

- Brian Zimmerman (Radnor Fire/EMS Director)
 - o Discussed the status of the Pulse Point project
 - Brian explained there has been no movement at the County level and has yet to receive a response from DES to move forward
- Andy Pancoast (Radnor Codes)
 - Advised Villanova University has hit rock while attempting to construct a new building on main campus. The crews will need to begin blasting
 - Pancoast will provide dates and times of the blasting to Township staff and this group in case calls are received during that time
- Sgt. Gluck (OEM)
 - Discussed Delaware County Emergency Management has created new damage assessment software which can be used through a phone or tablet
 - The software is in the early stages and training is expected in the future
